# Concepts: Holy and Profane, Clean and Unclean

Lev 10.8 The LORD then spoke to Aaron, saying, <sup>9</sup> “Do not drink wine or strong drink, neither you nor your sons with you, when you come into the tent of meeting, so that you will not die—it is a perpetual statute throughout your generations—<sup>10</sup> and so as to make a distinction between the holy and the profane, and between the unclean and the clean, <sup>11</sup> and so as to teach the sons of Israel all the statutes which the LORD has spoken to them through Moses.”

# Categories: Diet | Leviticus 11

<sup>46</sup> This is the law regarding the animal and the bird, and every living thing that moves in the waters and everything that swarms on the earth, <sup>47</sup> to make a distinction between the unclean and the clean, and between the edible creature and the creature which is not to be eaten.

# Categories: Deliveries | Leviticus 12

<sup>2</sup> “When a woman gives birth and bears a male child, then she shall be unclean for seven days, as in the days of her menstruation she shall be unclean. <sup>3</sup> On the eighth day the flesh of his foreskin shall be circumcised. <sup>4</sup> Then she shall remain in the blood of her purification for thirty-three days; she shall not touch any consecrated thing, nor enter the sanctuary until the days of her purification are completed. <sup>5</sup> But if she bears a female child, then she shall be unclean for two weeks, as in her menstruation; and she shall remain in the blood of her purification for sixty-six days.

# Categories: Diseases | Leviticus 13–14

**13:2** “When a man has on the skin of his body a swelling or a scab or a bright spot, and it becomes an infection of leprosy on the skin of his body, then he shall be brought to Aaron the priest or to one of his sons the priests.

**13:47** “When a garment has a mark of leprosy in it... <sup>49</sup> if the mark is greenish or reddish in the garment or in the leather, or in the warp or in the woof, or in any article of leather, it is a leprous mark and shall be shown to the priest.

**14:34** “When you enter the land of Canaan... and I put a mark of leprosy on a house in the land of your possession, <sup>35</sup> then the one who owns the house shall come and tell the priest, saying, ‘Something like a mark of leprosy has become visible to me in the house.’

# Categories: Discharges | Leviticus 15

<sup>1</sup>The LORD also spoke to Moses and to Aaron, saying, <sup>2</sup>“Speak to the sons of Israel, and say to them, ‘When any man has a discharge from his body, his discharge is unclean.

<sup>31</sup>“Thus you shall keep the sons of Israel separated from their uncleanness, so that they will not die in their uncleanness by their defiling My tabernacle that is among them.”

# Completion: Jesus Cleanses and Consecrates Us

<sup>40</sup> And a leper came to Jesus, beseeching Him and falling on his knees before Him, and saying, "If You are willing, You can make me clean." <sup>41</sup> Moved with compassion, Jesus stretched out His hand and touched him, and said to him, "I am willing; be cleansed." <sup>42</sup> Immediately the leprosy left him and he was cleansed. (Mark 1)

# Completion: Jesus Cleanses and Consecrates Us

<sup>20</sup> A woman who had been suffering from a hemorrhage for twelve years, came up behind Him and touched the fringe of His cloak; <sup>21</sup> for she was saying to herself, “If I only touch His garment, I will get well.” <sup>22</sup> But Jesus turning and seeing her said, “Daughter, take courage; your faith has made you well.” At once the woman was made well. (Matthew 9)

# Completion: Jesus Cleanses and Consecrates Us

<sup>18</sup> Do you not understand that whatever goes into the man from outside cannot defile him, <sup>19</sup> because it does not go into his heart, but into his stomach, and is eliminated?" (Thus He declared all foods clean.)

# Completion: Jesus Cleanses and Explains

<sup>20</sup> And He was saying, “That which proceeds out of the man, that is what defiles the man. <sup>21</sup> For from within, out of the heart of men, proceed the evil thoughts, fornications, thefts, murders, adulteries, <sup>22</sup> deeds of coveting and wickedness, as well as deceit, sensuality, envy, slander, pride and foolishness. <sup>23</sup> All these evil things proceed from within and defile the man.”

# Completion: Jesus Cleanses and Explains

<sup>9</sup> Peter went up on the housetop about the sixth hour to pray. <sup>10</sup> But he became hungry and was desiring to eat; but while they were making preparations, he fell into a trance; <sup>11</sup> and he saw the sky opened up, and an object like a great sheet coming down, lowered by four corners to the ground, <sup>12</sup> and there were in it all kinds of four-footed animals and crawling creatures of the earth and birds of the air. <sup>13</sup> A voice came to him, "Get up, Peter, kill and eat!" <sup>14</sup> But Peter said, "By no means, Lord, for I have never eaten anything unholy and unclean." <sup>15</sup> Again a voice came to him a second time, "What God has cleansed, no longer consider unholy." <sup>16</sup> This happened three times, and immediately the object was taken up into the sky. (Acts 10)

# Completion: Jesus Cleanses and Explains

<sup>24</sup> On the following day he entered Caesarea. Now Cornelius was waiting for them and had called together his relatives and close friends.... <sup>28</sup> And [Peter] said to them, “You yourselves know how unlawful it is for a man who is a Jew to associate with a foreigner or to visit him; and yet God has shown me that I should not call any man unholy or unclean.  
(Acts 10)
