Israel's Second Census | Numbers 26

¹Then it came about after the plague, that the LORD spoke to Moses and to Eleazar the son of Aaron the priest, saying,
²“Take a census of all the congregation of the sons of Israel from twenty years old and upward, by their fathers’ households, whoever is able to go out to war in Israel.” ³ So Moses and Eleazar the priest spoke with them in the plains of Moab by the Jordan at Jericho, saying, ⁴“Take a census of the people from twenty years old and upward, as the LORD has commanded Moses.”

⁶³ These are those who were numbered by Moses and Eleazar the priest, who numbered the sons of Israel in the plains of Moab by the Jordan at Jericho. ⁶⁴ But among these there was not a man of those who were numbered by Moses and Aaron the priest, who numbered the sons of Israel in the wilderness of Sinai. ⁶⁵ For the LORD had said of them, "They shall surely die in the wilderness." And not a man was left of them, except Caleb the son of Jephunneh and Joshua the son of Nun.

⁵³ “Among these the land shall be divided for an inheritance according to the number of names. ⁵⁴ To the larger group you shall increase their inheritance, and to the smaller group you shall diminish their inheritance; each shall be given their inheritance according to those who were numbered of them. ⁵⁵ But the land shall be divided by lot. They shall receive their inheritance according to the names of the tribes of their fathers. ⁵⁶ According to the selection by lot, their inheritance shall be divided between the larger and the smaller groups.”

¹² Then the LORD said to Moses, "Go up to this mountain of Abarim, and see the land which I have given to the sons of Israel. ¹³ When you have seen it, you too will be gathered to your people, as Aaron your brother was; ¹⁴ for in the wilderness of Zin, during the strife of the congregation, you rebelled against My command to treat Me as holy before their eyes at the water." (These are the waters of Meribah of Kadesh in the wilderness of Zin.)

¹⁵ Then Moses spoke to the LORD, saying, ¹⁶ “May the LORD, the God of the spirits of all flesh, appoint a man over the congregation, ¹⁷ who will go out and come in before them, and who will lead them out and bring them in, so that the congregation of the LORD will not be like sheep which have no shepherd.”

18 So the LORD said to Moses, "Take Joshua the son of Nun, a man in whom is the Spirit, and lay your hand on him; **19** and have him stand before Eleazar the priest and before all the congregation, and commission him in their sight. **20** You shall put some of your authority on him, in order that all the congregation of the sons of Israel may obey him.

Keeping God Central: Scheduled Sacrifices | Numbers 28

28.1 Then the LORD spoke to Moses, saying, ² “Command the sons of Israel and say to them, ‘You shall be careful to present My offering, My food for My offerings by fire, of a soothing aroma to Me, at their appointed time.’

⁴ You shall offer the one lamb in the morning and the other lamb you shall offer at twilight;

⁹ Then on the sabbath day two male lambs one year old without defect, and two-tenths of an ephah of fine flour mixed with oil as a grain offering, and its drink offering: ¹⁰ This is the burnt offering of every sabbath in addition to the continual burnt offering and its drink offering.

Keeping God Central: Scheduled Sacrifices | Numbers 28

¹¹ 'Then at the beginning of each of your months you shall present a burnt offering to the LORD: a fourth of a hin for a lamb; this is the burnt offering of each month throughout the months of the year.

¹⁵ And one male goat for a sin offering to the LORD; it shall be offered with its drink offering in addition to the continual burnt offering.

Keeping God Central: Holy Days | Numbers 28

16 'Then on the fourteenth day of the first month shall be the LORD'S Passover.

17 'On the fifteenth day of this month shall be a feast, unleavened bread shall be eaten for seven days. [Feast of Unleavened Bread]

26 'Also on the day of the first fruits, when you present a new grain offering to the LORD in your Feast of Weeks, you shall have a holy convocation; you shall do no laborious work. [Feast of Pentecost]

Keeping God Central: Seventh Month Holy Days | Numbers 29

29.1 'Now in the seventh month, on the first day of the month, you shall also have a holy convocation; you shall do no laborious work. It will be to you a day for blowing trumpets. [Feast of Trumpets, Rosh Hashanah]

7 'Then on the tenth day of this seventh month you shall have a holy convocation, and you shall humble yourselves; you shall not do any work. [Day of Atonement, Yom Kippur]

12 'Then on the fifteenth day of the seventh month you shall have a holy convocation; you shall do no laborious work, and you shall observe a feast to the LORD for seven days. [Feast of Tabernacles]
