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# God Created All Things | Genesis 1:1

In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth.

# God Created Mankind | Genesis 1:26

<sup>26</sup> Then God said, "Let Us make man in Our image, according to Our likeness; and let them rule over the fish of the sea and over the birds of the sky and over the cattle and over all the earth, and over every creeping thing that creeps on the earth."

# God Created Adam | Genesis 2:7–8

<sup>7</sup> Then the LORD God formed man of dust from the ground, and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life; and man became a living being. <sup>8</sup> The LORD God planted a garden toward the east, in Eden; and there He placed the man whom He had formed.

# God Created Eve | Genesis 2:21–22

<sup>21</sup> The LORD God caused a deep sleep to fall upon the man, and he slept; then He took one of his ribs and closed up the flesh at that place. <sup>22</sup> The LORD God fashioned into a woman the rib which He had taken from the man, and brought her to the man.

# God's Command | Genesis 2:16–17

**<sup>16</sup> The LORD God commanded the man, saying, “From any tree of the garden you may eat freely; <sup>17</sup> but from the tree of the knowledge of good and evil you shall not eat, for in the day that you eat from it you will surely die.”**

# Temptation | Genesis 3:1–5

<sup>1</sup> Now the serpent was more crafty than any beast of the field which the Lord God had made. And he said to the woman, “Indeed, has God said, ‘You shall not eat from any tree of the garden?’” <sup>2</sup> The woman said to the serpent, “From the fruit of the trees of the garden we may eat; <sup>3</sup> but from the fruit of the tree which is in the middle of the garden, God has said, ‘You shall not eat from it or touch it, or you will die.’ ” <sup>4</sup> The serpent said to the woman, “You surely will not die! <sup>5</sup> For God knows that in the day you eat from it your eyes will be opened, and you will be like God, knowing good and evil.”

# Disobedience | Genesis 3:6

**⁆ When the woman saw that the tree was good for food, and that it was a delight to the eyes, and that the tree was desirable to make one wise, she took from its fruit and ate; and she gave also to her husband with her, and he ate.**

# God's Covenant with Abraham | Genesis 12:1-3

<sup>1</sup> Now the LORD said to Abram, "Go forth from your country, and from your relatives and from your father's house, to the land which I will show you; <sup>2</sup> and I will make you a great nation, and I will bless you, and make your name great; and so you shall be a blessing; <sup>3</sup> And I will bless those who bless you, and the one who curses you I will curse. And in you all the families of the earth will be blessed."

# God's Covenant with Abraham | Genesis 15:5–6

<sup>5</sup> “Now look toward the heavens, and count the stars, if you are able to count them...So shall your descendants be.” <sup>6</sup> Then [Abram] believed in the LORD; and He reckoned it to him as righteousness.

## Abraham – Father of the Faithful | Galatians 3:6–9

<sup>6</sup> Abraham believed God, and it was reckoned to him as righteousness. <sup>7</sup> Therefore, be sure that it is those who are of faith who are sons of Abraham. <sup>8</sup> The Scripture, foreseeing that God would justify the Gentiles by faith, preached the gospel beforehand to Abraham, saying, “All the nations will be blessed in you.” <sup>9</sup> So then those who are of faith are blessed with Abraham, the believer.

## God Announces Israel's Bondage and Exodus | Genesis 15:13–16

<sup>13</sup> God said to Abram, "Know for certain that your descendants will be strangers in a land that is not theirs, where they will be enslaved and oppressed four hundred years. <sup>14</sup> But I will also judge the nation whom they will serve, and afterward they will come out with many possessions. <sup>15</sup> As for you, you shall go to your fathers in peace; you will be buried at a good old age. <sup>16</sup> Then in the fourth generation they will return here, for the iniquity of the Amorite is not yet complete."

# God Covenants with Israel | Exodus 19:4–6

<sup>4</sup> 'You yourselves have seen what I did to the Egyptians, and how I bore you on eagles' wings, and brought you to Myself. <sup>5</sup> 'Now then, if you will indeed obey My voice and keep My covenant, then you shall be My own possession among all the peoples, for all the earth is Mine; <sup>6</sup> and you shall be to Me a kingdom of priests and a holy nation.'

# The Bible's Bookends

| Genesis 1–3                              | Revelation 20–22                         |
|------------------------------------------|------------------------------------------|
| 1 <sup>st</sup> earth created (1:1)      | 1 <sup>st</sup> earth passes away (21:1) |
| Darkness / night (1:5)                   | No night / darkness (22:5)               |
| Seas (1:10)                              | No longer any sea (21:1)                 |
| Sun governs the day (1:16)               | No need for the sun (21:23)              |
| Rivers in Eden (2:10–14)                 | River for the earth (22:1)               |
| Bride for 1 <sup>st</sup> Adam (2:18–23) | Bride for last Adam (21:2)               |
| Beginning of sin (ch. 3)                 | End of sin (21:22)                       |
| Serpent doomed (3:15)                    | Serpent destroyed (20:10)                |
| Curses issued (3:14, 17)                 | No longer any curse (22:3)               |
| Sorrows begin (3:17)                     | Sorrows ended (21:4)                     |
| Death comes (3:19)                       | No more death (21:4)                     |
| Eviction from Eden (3:24)                | Return to Paradise (ch. 22)              |
| Tree of life guarded (3:24)              | Tree of life granted (22:14)             |



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
